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For the Love of Animals

Every year the South Dakota Angus Association gives out heifer grants to South Dakota youth to help in the purchasing of livestock. Reese Otter of Faulkton, South Dakota is one of the most recent recipients.

She plans to use the money to purchase a heifer to begin her dream of “raising cattle for the rest of my life.”

Otter understands what that statement

means. She knows cattle are not all fun and no work, in fact she knows they are a lot of work, having been raised on her family’s cattle and crop farm. Still, that doesn’t dissuade her.

“I have always appreciated the cattle more than the crops. I help with calving and working the cattle. I can do most things... running the chute, vaccinating, tagging, moving them and I have bottle calves every year.”

The daughter of Joe and Tracy, and sister to James and Evan, she is a senior at Faulkton High School who is ready for all that her senior year has to offer but is also looking down the road. Not yet settled on exactly what route she will take, Otter is interested in the Army National Guard and also obtaining a degree in animal science. She might even consider a veterinarian degree.

“Ever since I was little, I have had animals around me. So many

animals. I love them and I want my world to stay centered around them in any way I can,” Otter says.

“One of my favorite things is to see the calves in the spring and to see the color patterns they have. To see the potential they have,” Otter reflects.

While she has shown pigs, lambs and Simmental cattle, this summer

she spent time showing an Angus heifer she purchased from Jade Jandel. “He’s a really great guy and was the one that actually told me about the heifer grant through the association,” Otter says. “I will be showing the heifer I got from Jade at the South Dakota State Fair.”

Showing and the process of preparing animals for the show ring

is another aspect of farm life Otter enjoys. She has even been called upon to help other kids learn the ropes of livestock showing. And once at the shows? “I love to help unload and get animals settled in. I’ll show beginners the show basics, help prep animals and be there ringside. I like to help wherever and whenever I can.”

Charles Mogck: Things I’ve Learned as an AAA Board Member

This November at the American Angus Association’s annual convention, Charles Mogck of Olivet, South Dakota

will have fulfilled his second and last term as a board member for the Association.

The Mogck family is multi-generational Angus breeders that

have been involved in both the state and national associations as well as the junior programs over the years.

Charles says he wanted to serve on the board

to give back to an Association that had given him so much over the years. “I believe that people need to give back to things that they’re passionate about. And I was at a time in my life where I could with my kids coming home.”

In mid-August, Charles offered a few candid thoughts on his experience with the board and what he learned while serving his six years.

Everyone Wants to Leave the Breed Better

The American Angus Association board is made up of 15 individuals from throughout the United States. They represent a vast array of Angus members that have different operation styles, goals and climates in which they operate. A board director might be in a region heavy with members that make their income from selling show heifers and another director might represent a part of the country that is heavy cow/calf operations.

“No one on the board has a strong agenda and wants to change the breed in anyway. What I learned was that we all have different needs and every need is important to the association. Diversity is necessary and we want to leave the breed better.”

Wanting to leave the breed better often means a compromise according to Mogck. “So as a member of the board, you vote on things that might not

really benefit you, but it will benefit the breed overall.”

The Structure

Mogck says when he first started on the board, he found it really interesting that there is the Association and then there are also four entities tied to it – Angus Genetics, Inc., Certified Angus Beef, Angus Productions Inc., and the American Angus Foundation.

Those four have helped drive the Angus breed to be the number one cattle breed in the U.S. today.

“It really is amazing the work everyone is doing and how it all relates to one another,” Mogck says.

There are also committees within the American Angus Association board and Mogck has sat on many of them including breed improvement, finance and planning, commercial programs and member services.

“The committees are really important because they’re the ones that sort out and bring topics that we need to discuss to the full board,” says Mogck. “It makes the board meetings more efficient.”

A Big Driver? Certified Angus Beef

The branded beef program, Certified Angus Beef, got its start back in the 1970s when the then AAA board narrowly passed approval on it.

“I always thought CAB was about steak. But it’s more than that. It’s about the brisket, and the higher end hamburg-

ers, and the skirt steaks that are great for tacos. It’s adding value to the overall carcass,” says Mogck.

CAB has spent decades researching, fabricating, supplying, marketing and promoting the beef raised by Angus producers in the United States. It has done it well with CAB being one of the most recognized meat labels on the market today.

“Once you get on the Board and see what Certified Angus Beef has done... has created the demand for Angus beef... you sort of start seeing why we are the largest beef breed,” Mogck says. “Because it all goes back to the consumer and what the consumer wants and the consumer wants CAB.”

Global Impact

“When we went to the World Angus Forum in Australia last year, you quickly realized that the American Angus Association just isn’t for U.S. producers. It’s a worldwide used association. They rely on our data probably just as much

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Connecting the Pieces

How does data from different environments fit together in the genetic evaluation?

Angus breeders and their commercial customers operate in a wide variety of different environments and management systems. The data collected across these different management systems all comes together in the weekly evaluation to inform genetic selection tools. The capability to utilize phenotypic data for accurate genetic evaluation relies on a few key factors.

Contemporary Groups

Phenotypes are the driving force behind the genetic evaluation. However, the use of phenotypes within the genetic evaluation is heavily dependent on proper contemporary grouping.

Contemporary groups are groups of animals who have had the equal opportunity to perform

for a trait. Typically, these are animals of similar age, managed alike, and the same sex, although each trait has its own specific contemporary group criteria. Contemporary groups are formed when data is submitted to the Association.

Every phenotype is influenced by both the animal's genetics and the environment in which it was raised; however, only genetics can be passed onto progeny. When animals are exposed to different management or environment, it is impossible to know if differences in performance are due to the influence of the environment or the animal's genetics. To attribute differences in performance to genetics, the animals within a contemporary group must have been exposed to the same management and environment.

In the genetic evaluation, contemporary groups help account for the effect of the environment on the phenotype, so genetic merit can be estimated. Well-designed contemporary groups are the cornerstone of the genetic evaluation and are vital to accurately calculating genetic selection tools.

Without a proper contemporary group, phenotypic data may be excluded from the genetic evaluation because comparisons cannot be made between animals exposed to the same environmental influences.

Connectedness

Phenotypic differences within a contemporary group show how an individual performs compared to those raised within the same environment, but how are those differences compared across different environments? Comparisons across environments (i.e. between contemporary groups) are dependent on the degree at which those groups are genetically connected to each other, which is referred to as connectedness. As breeders source more genetics from outside their own herds, they are increasing how connected their herd is to the rest of the population. These connections are determined based on genetic relationships between animals.

In 1972, the Angus Board of Directors removed restrictions on the use of artificial insemination (AI) within the Angus breed. This opened the opportunity

for sires to sire registered progeny across different herds rather than only by those who owned them.

With the phenotypic data collected across herds, expected progeny differences (EPDs) could be calculated with greater accuracy than would be possible with limited connectedness across herds. This connectedness not only benefited AI sires, but also natural service sires whose progeny performance were being compared to the progeny of AI sires. During that same board meeting, the national sire evaluation program was also approved, which led to the release of the first Sire Evaluation Report in 1974. These monumental decisions were foundational in the early adoption of EPDs within the Angus breed, and subsequently the beef industry.

Now, more than 50 years later, the Angus breed is more interconnected than ever. In addition to AI usage, connectedness has also improved with the increased use of embryo transfer technology and the growth in the global demand for Angus genetics, which expands connectedness beyond the borders of the United States. As connectedness improves, so does the ability to tie more data together by creating genetic links between animals that are raised across different environments, which consequently adds more information to each individual EPD estimate. Additionally, accounting for connectedness has tremendously improved with genomic technology, which can determine more accurate relationships than traditional pedigree alone.

Conclusion

Phenotypes are influenced by both the genetics an animal inherits and the environment in which it is raised. With well-structured contemporary groups, the genetic evaluation can more effectively separate genetic merit from environmental influence. Each animal's phenotype contributes value on its own, but its impact is multiplied when it is connected to individuals exposed to different environmental conditions.

The strength of the Angus genetic evaluation lies in the collective contribution of breeders working together. As connectedness increases and more high-quality data are submitted, the evaluation becomes more powerful, providing more accurate selection tools that benefit everyone who uses Angus genetics.

as their own data within the country," Mogck says.

This drove home for him the fact that the Angus breed, and in turn the utilization of the services provided by the American Angus Association is much greater than he knew.

Discussion is Key

There is a Benjamin Franklin quote that says, "The world is run by those who show up." Charles Mogck might add, "and discuss."

Mogck says he doesn't believe anyone should sit on a board of any

type and not provide input at meetings. "By doing nothing you're not progressing anything. We need to always be open-minded and willing to discuss."

His Advice

To the new board of directors that will be elected in November Mogck reiterates his prior thoughts.

"Don't be afraid to give your opinion and your thoughts. Sitting in a board room saying nothing isn't what you're supposed to do. Give your input and your views and more discussion will happen throughout the room and that betters the breed and the association."
